

HEIGHTS HIGH CLASS OF 1956 TO CELEBRATE 60TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION

The 60th anniversary celebration of the Cleveland Heights High School's class of June 1956 presents, in many ways, a sociological snapshot of young life in Cleveland at mid-20th century.

Then, Heights High's population of the June class of 1956 was 434 students. Many of them were born in the inner city Glenville and Kinsman neighborhoods, and moved to the Heights amid a massive migration in the 1940s and 50s. The sons and daughters of tradesmen and fledgling entrepreneurs, as well as a smattering of professionals began to prosper during and after World War II. Many Heights graduates became the first of their families to attend college.

Significantly, a large number of these graduates left Cleveland to follow careers in 37 states. California was the recipient of 34 of them, with Florida a close second, with 31. Still, 157 remained in Ohio. Four of them settled in Hawaii, which entered statehood in 1959, and one in Alaska. Most recent records show that two settled in Europe, and four in Israel.

The June 1956 class has proven to be close-knit, having celebrated reunions every 10 years, beginning in 1966, as well as marking significant group birthdays, such as ages 55, 60, 65, 70 and 75. Most of these events have scored attendances of a hundred or more.

Our classmates have travelled to this reunion weekend from as far away as Israel to the east, and as far west as California. Most of the classmates are now 78 years old, and we are all looking forward to celebrating together and meeting for many more years to come.

- ~ 1996 Owner Art Modell takes the Cleveland team to Baltimore but leaves the name and the colors. Browns' fans and city officials orchestrate an unprecedented campaign to bring Browns back to Cleveland and build a new stadium
- ∼ April 1999 Two Columbine H.S. students kill 12 students and a teacher
- ➤ Dec. 31, 1999 Y2K: People were afraid computer programs would not shift from two-digit years to the four that were now needed to distinguish the year 2000 from 1900, potentially causing widespread critical infrastructure failure
- ∼ 1999 Controversial rapper Eminen tops the charts; Crosby, Stills, Nash and Young make a successful comeback
- September 11, 2001 − (9/11) Series of terrorist suicide attacks committed in U.S., killing nearly 3000 people. World Trade Center destroyed.
- Cotober 23, 2001 iPods are here
- ∼ November 2002 Homeland Security Act passed
- ∼ February 1, 2003 Space shuttle Columbia disintegrates, killing all 7 astronauts
- ~ 2003 Beyoncé is pop music's biggest star
- ~ March 2003 Beginning of Iraq war
- ~2004 − Massachusetts becomes the first state to legalize same-sex marriage

- ~ 2014 Cavs hire David Blatt, a coach from the international league. LEBRON JAMES COMES HOME!
- ~ 2015 Supreme Court legalizes same-sex marriage in all 50 states
- ~ 2015 Cavs go to Eastern Division finals but lose to Golden State Warriors
- ~ 2015– Cleveland Play House and Karamu celebrate their 100th anniversaries
- ~ 2016 LeBron James, Kyrie Irving, and Kevin Love lead the team to become NBA World Champs. *GO CAVS!*
- → July 2016 Cleveland Indians are in first place by six games at All-Star break, owning a 13 game winning streak. Go Tribe!
